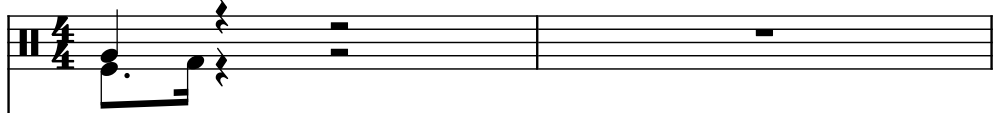

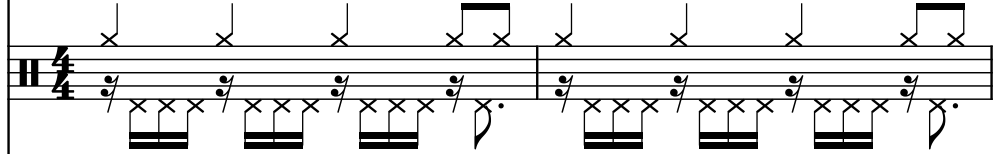

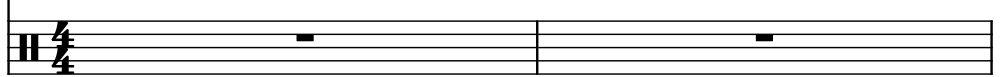

4-Piece Drum Kit, Percussion

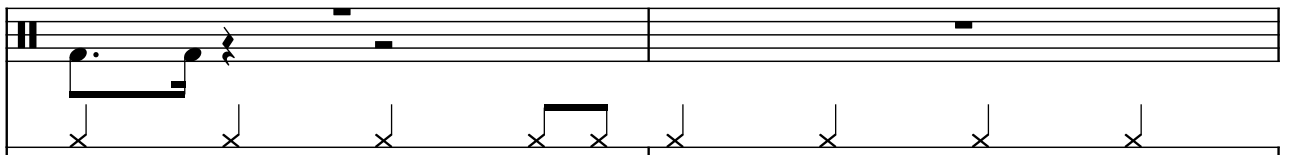

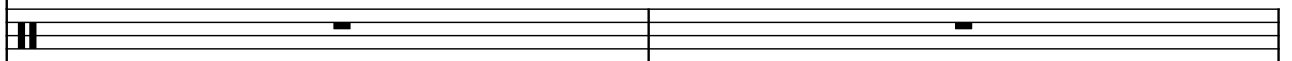
